Vocabulary Questions:

- 1. In the section "Life in Space," in the second paragraph, the author says of some foods that although "they are perfectly *innocuous* on Earth, they can be downright dangerous in space." Using context clues, what does *innocuous* means?
- 2. Explain why you need *gravity* to flush a regular toilet. What do you predict might happen from flushing a toilet without gravity? (Don't be overly gross.)

Text Evidence/Content Questions:

- 1. Write in your own words a summary of where the solid and liquid waste go on the International Space Station. Why are they processed differently?
- 2. Find two *analogies*—comparisons made to show such a similarity—that the author uses. For each, explain why the author chooses to make these comparisons.
- 3. Why is it "even more challenging" to use the bathroom when astronauts take a walk outside their spacecraft? How do astronauts overcome this problem when they take space walks?

Writing Prompt:

Using evidence from the text, explain how technology is essential for humans to live in outer space. Give at least <u>two</u> detailed examples from the article that support the idea that if it were not for technology, space exploration would be impossible.
